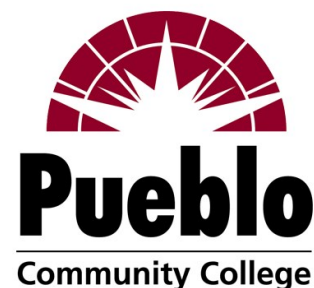

Important End-of-Semester Reminders

Minimum Expectations

All faculty and instructors are expected to complete a **minimum of one assessment** for at least one class *each semester*—more are encouraged!

Scoring Deadline

Student scores on assessment rubrics must be entered into eLumen by the grading deadline—that means the Spring 2018 deadline is **MONDAY, MAY 14!**
