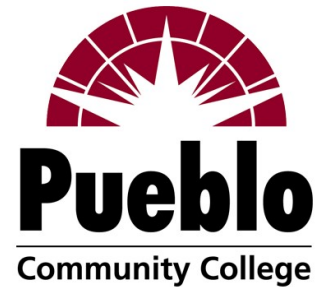

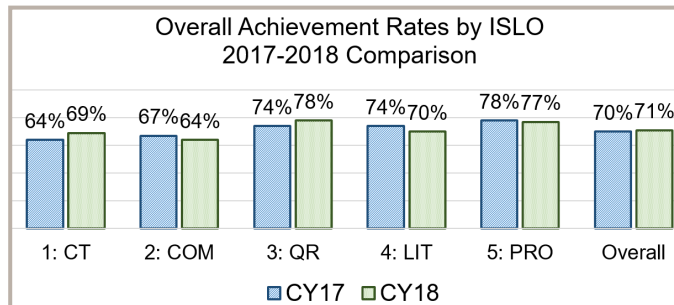
Timeline Reminder

2018 Cycle Recap

On-Target Performance
Student performance on PCC's 5 core institutional learning outcomes remained steady from 2017 to 2018. Communication continues to be an area of underperformance, but there was a slight increase in achievement overall, solidly meeting our target of 70%



Growing Participation

There has been a steady increase in the number of individuals who have completed assessments by entering student scores into eLumen over, and in 2018, approximately 45% of all instructional staff participated in assessment.

Participants	2017	2018
All Instructional Staff	140 / 442 (33%)	176 / 393 (45%)
Full-Time Faculty	87 / 109 (80%)	88 / 97 (91%)
Part-Time Instructors	53 / 313 (17%)	88 / 296 (30%)

Additionally, of the 923 total assessments planned, 61% (560) assessments were completed, an increase from 46% in 2017 (448/972). One third of all those assessments were completed by part-time instructors.
